PASSING ON SKILLS TO OUR YOUTH

ABOUTUS

The Young Knitters Club was the initiative of a local retired woman who realised that school-going children in her area did not know how to knit when they came home with a knitting project and she had to do it for them. She decided to ensure that this skill was passed on to the next generation. Auntie Connie found a space and invited her neighbour's children to learn with her. From the first lesson with 10 girls, three weeks later Auntie Connie had more than 30 girls and boys learning to knit with the help of local volunteers. They've since held their own fundraiser to buy more supplies.

CONTEXT

Currently operating out of a communal container, Connie ensures that once the children have learnt to knit, they have their own needles and wool to continue at home. She constantly has new children arriving on her doorstep asking to join. Connie has plans to grow the Young Knitters Club in local schools and to take it further afield to other communities.

Passing on a basic skill to children that has multiple benefits, including aiding concentration, handeye co-ordination and most importantly bringing the community together and the children into safe spaces.
